1. Minutes of the last Meeting

3. Report of the Chairman covering the activities of the Parish Council

The Meeting was pleased to receive the Chairman's report on the work of the Council for the year 2014/15.

4. Parish Council Accounts 2014-15

A summary of the Parish Council Receipts and Payments Accounts for 2014/15, copies of which had been circulated, was noted.

5. Parish Affairs

The Open public forum generated a number of questions including:

- Council were asked if they could confirm the dates required for use of the Village Hall, the booking form was handed to the Village Hall booking secretary who also confirmed that there was no longer a need for Meetings to start at 8.15 pm from September.
- Council were asked whether the work on Barrack Hill triangle had been completed, TPx confirmed that the first stage had but there was no firm date for the 2nd stage or a total cost for the project. TPx asked if there were any comments on the work so far. Responses were mixed but majority felt it was an improvement.
- Council were asked if there were plans to have white lines repainted especially around the school. TPx responded that if the Village wanted white lines repainted then it was something that could be discussed at a future Parish Council meeting but due to costs it could mean that the precept would have to be raised to generate funding. MP informed the forum that it was important to report these issues to Transport for Bucks and also to get the school on board.
